virtualPACS will communicate with the Medweb PACS server installed at the University of Cincinnati Medical Center, where radiologists will provide remote diagnosis and consultation and also have access to 13 Shoulder to Shoulder affiliated U.S. hospitals. Scanned documents, patient demographics and DICOM studies are sent to the local virtualPACS module via DICOM, stored in its short-term archive and then routed to the radiology group. The gateway also serves as a local server for clinicians in Honduras, who can then retrieve copies of their patients' studies, reports and scanned documents.
